The purpose of 'Finding a Voice' could be summed up in the words of the King's speech therapist: 'To give them faith in their voice and let them know a friend is listening.'* The course, which offers five group sessions plus weekly material for private reading, uses the film as a discussion starter and relates it to what the Bible has to say about such universal issues as discouragement and determination, fear and friendship, calling and courage". This group is for everyone: you do not have to have seen the film and you do not have to have been to a study group before.

## **Guest Speaker: Revd Professor Norman Drummond**

Revd Professor Norman Drummond is the chair of the Scottish World War One Commemorations Panel. He served as a Chaplain in The Parachute Regiment and The Black Watch. Former Headmaster of Loretto and BBC National Governor for Scotland, Professor Drummond is a visiting Professor of Leadership in Education at the University of Edinburgh. He has been a Chaplain to the Queen in Scotland since 1993. He is the Founder and President of Columba 1400, an award winning social enterprise and charity, helping "young people realise that they already have the inner greatness and confidence to transform their own lives and those around them".

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
